Society of 1918 members:

Now that we have triumphantly brought the *For the Bold* campaign to a close, there is no better time to express gratitude for the philanthropic support for W&M provided by

members of the Society of 1918. Collectively, the members of the Society and their spouses and partners have contributed just shy of \$475 million to W&M throughout their lifetime. Yes, you read that correctly — **\$475 million!** That is nearly half a billion from just 480 women! And, the 480 Society members have raised **\$4.3 million** for the Alumnae Initiatives Endowment alone.

How do you spell impact? I say Society of 1918!

Speaking of the endowment, did you know that in order to produce impactful income, there are minimum giving levels to establish an endowment? For example, depending on the market and the spending rate adopted by the W&M Foundation, a \$100,000 endowment, with a spending rate of 3-4%, would produce \$3,000-\$4,000 for use annually. You can more information about endowment requirements on the Naming Opportunities site, but \$100,000 is the lowest available endowment available.

When it came time to launch the Alumnae Initiatives Endowment and with an eye toward the collective impact of women's philanthropy, 10 women came together, each participating at the \$10,000 level, to launch the endowment. I'd like to call them out and thank them for taking the leap of faith that their seed money would grow into impactful funding for women's initiatives into perpetuity. Those pioneering women are:

And these women just happen to be the first 10! Within weeks of launching the endowment, membership and contributions grew quickly and exponentially. Within the first year we had 100 charter members, and now, in just a little over two years, our membership has grown nearly 50 times those initial 10 women. Using the same calculation above, this year the endowment will provide \$60,000 for women's initiatives. We are excited to continue to bring programming to our members, and even more importantly, value-added opportunities for ALL W&M women! We are in the early planning stages for W&M Women's Weekend — the sequel — and can't wait until fall

2021 when we again bring hundreds of W&M women together to celebrate and continue to grow our collective impact.

Society of 1918 member Sybil Shainwald '49 has made a transformative gift a over 100 pieces of art to the Muscarellle Museum, nearly all of which portray women and many were created by women. This gift will help the Muscarelle address women artists who have historically been undervalued and underepresented. Thank you, Sybil!

Henri Matisse, Pablo Picasso, Richard Avedon, Man Ray, Helen Levitt, Louise Nevelson, Henry Moore, Willem de Kooning and Dorothea Tanning are just a few of the artists represented in the 100 works of art that Shainwald is donating via her estate to William & Mary. Upon viewing the art, a theme quickly emerges — nearly all the pieces portray women and many were created by female artists.

"At the time I started collecting, I thought that women artists and their work were undervalued and underrepresented," Shainwald says. That is changing and this transformative gift puts William & Mary in a position to accelerate that positive change.
